\*We may not spend the funds as exactly stated due to circumstances. This is just a guiding framework that we use.

We now provide seeds to families to enable them grow their food and improve food security at household level. These are given during the rainy season.

Periodic expenses are highlighted in **bold**.

Your annual investment (donation) is **\$600**. In summary:

- \$45 goes towards school fees
- \$96 goes towards incoming wire fees (bank charges)
- \$144 goes towards food
- \$60 goes towards toiletries (soap, lotion, toothbrush etc.)
- \$40 goes towards examination fees
- \$55 goes towards clothing
- \$10 buys a Christmas present for your sponsored child (and her/his family)
- \$30 buys learning materials
- \$30 buys a school bag
- \$25 buys a school uniform for your sponsored child
- \$15 buys a mosquito bed net (for malaria protection)
- \$50 buys seedlings for the farming season (helps with food security in the home)
